

BANKSETA CONTINUES TO DEVELOP SKILLS IN KZN

A new learnerships, Banking Service Advice & Retail Banking Sales was successfully piloted at Aspire Voice Pty Ltd in partnership with Banking Sector Education and Training Authority (BANKSETA) during the 2015/2016 training year.



The learnership, funded by BANKSETA and facilitated by Felix Risk Training Consultants, included training through interactive sessions by expert facilitators on a monthly basis over a year at Aspire's uMhlanga office.

The main purpose of the interactive sessions was to introduce new learning material to the candidates, further building the foundations of their experience. There were two remediation and final sing-off sessions held after all theoretical training was completed. The learners were then required to complete and submit Assessment Guides relating to the Unit standards which included written assignments, the submission of product samples and the completion of a workplace log-book.

an environment where learning is regarded as a vital part of the everyday work function. It was also a company objective to ensure that every learner achieved a nationally recognised qualification.
